# Church window honours couple

A NEW stained glass window has been installed at St Catherine's Church in East Tilbury dedicated to the memory of two former congregation members.

The window has been donated by the family and friends of George and Mabel Noakes, who were long-time residents of East Tilbury.

Mabel was a member of the Mothers' Union and the Good Companions Club and George was a civil engineer, working at West Thurrock, Tilbury Dungeness and Bradwell Power Stations.

George had been a member of The Home Guard during the Second World War, and the Probus Club, as well as a

trustee of the Coalhouse Fort Project.

The window shows waves depicting the storms of life, an anchor as a sign of faith, a star representing the Stella Maris, the Star of the Sea, and growing daffodils symbolising resurrection.

It has been designed and constructed by Philip Crook of Vitrail Studios of Newcastle, who is currently working on the restoration of stained glass at York Minster.

The window will be dedicated on July 27 during the 6pm service by the Right Reverend James Johnson, honorary assistant bishop in the Chelmsford Diocese.
